HONORS PROGRAM

The Honors Program is open to students who score in the top 10% of their class. They are enrolled in the most rigorous courses and participate in year-round leadership training and community outreach throughout their tenure at Elder High School. Participation in the Honors Program is so designated on the student's transcript.

COURSE LEVELS: As a comprehensive Catholic high school, Elder High School offers rigorous courses at various levels. Students are recommended for the various levels based upon ability and motivation .

Advanced Placement (AP)/Honors Level (H)– These courses are designed for the academically gifted and highly motivated student. Students enrolled in these courses are expected to have the ability to work independently, exhibit high levels of critical thinking including: analysis, application, evaluation, decision making, and complex problem solving. Students enrolled in AP courses will take the Advanced Placement Examination in May with the opportunity to earn college credit.

Advanced College Preparatory (ACP)– These courses are designed for students with above average ability. ACP courses require the student to work in a fast-paced environment with challenging course work requiring a high degree of self-motivation and critical thinking skills.

College Preparatory 1 (CP1)– These courses are designed to meet the college preparatory requirements of most universities and colleges. These courses develop comprehension, motivation, analytical skills, laboratory skills, and aural competencies.

College Preparatory 2 (CP2)– These courses are designed to meet the college preparatory requirements of most universities and colleges. CP2 courses cover the same basic material that is presented in CP1 courses; however these courses are implemented so that students will benefit from a more deliberate pace with differentiated instructional strategies and emphasis on fundamental concepts. Students placed in these courses are expected to pursue post –secondary education.

General Academics– These courses are designed for students that require remediation. Students who complete a course at this level may move on to a College Preparatory Level. Students placed in these courses are expected to pursue post-secondary education or training.
